He holds a Canada Research Chair in cultural economics and is affiliated with CIFAR, NBER, and BREAD. His research examines historical processes shaping institutions and cultures, focusing on factors like distrust, gender norms, and democracy. He also studies contemporary development topics such as Fair Trade, foreign aid, and climate shocks, with an emphasis on how local contexts influence the success of policies.
