Salma Mousa is an Assistant Professor of Political Science at UCLA. Her research focuses on social cohesion, particularly in post-conflict settings, and she collaborates with local governments and NGOs in the Middle East and beyond, often employing field experiments. Her work has been published in *Science* and the *American Political Science Review* and has been featured in *The Economist*, the *BBC*, *Der Spiegel*, *Freakonomics*, the *Times of London*, and *PBS NOVA*. Before joining UCLA, she was an Assistant Professor at Yale University. She earned her PhD in Political Science from Stanford University in 2020 and her BSc in International Politics from Georgetown University in Qatar.
